

Mauro Ettore was born in Tricarico, Matera, Italy, in 1979. He received the laurea degree *summa cum laude* in telecommunication engineering and the Ph.D. degree in electromagnetics from the University of Siena, Italy, in 2004 and 2008 respectively.

During his Master's degree studies he spent five months at the Technical University of Denmark (DTU), Lyngby, Denmark. Part of his PhD has been developed at the Defence, Security and Safety Institute of the Netherlands Organization for Applied Scientific Research (TNO), The Hague, The Netherlands, where afterwards he worked as antenna researcher.

From 2008 to 2010, he was a Postdoctoral Fellow at the Institut d'Electronique et de Télécommunications de Rennes (IETR), Université de Rennes 1, France.
